





The safety pin, a small yet essential tool used worldwide, was invented by Walter Hunt, an American mechanic, in 1849. Hunt was facing financial difficulties and needed to repay a \$15 debt. As he was pondering ways to earn quick money, he began fiddling with a piece of brass wire. Within just three hours, Hunt twisted and bent the wire into a pin with a spring mechanism that would secure the pin while also protecting the user from its sharp point. He called it the "safety pin" because of its unique clasp design that prevented injuries. Hunt patented his invention and sold the rights for \$400 to a company that manufactured and sold the pins. Although Hunt never profited further from his invention, the safety pin became an indispensable household item, widely used for fastening clothes, diapers, and many other purposes. Despite its simple design, the safety pin remains a brilliant example of functional and practical invention. It has since evolved into a variety of styles and sizes, serving numerous purposes beyond its original intent. Today, the safety pin is also used in fashion, arts and crafts, and even as a symbol of solidarity. Walter Hunt's creation demonstrates how a simple idea can have a lasting impact on the world.
